1st Floor Multipurpose Program Areas	2	Large programmatic spaces for youth services, tutoring and meal distribution.	\$500,000
Health & Wellness Distribution Room	1	Space to distribute health and wellness goods and resources to participants, their families and community members.	\$250,000
Student and Family Support Room	1	Open space with flexible seating for counseling and support services.	\$250,000

Garden	1	Relaxing, landscaped garden with seating for program participants and community members to gather.	\$150,000
Courtyard	1	Exterior courtyard where guests enter the Hub.	\$125,000
Kitchen	1	Food preparation, staging and distribution for student meals.	\$125,000
Stairwell	1	Where staff and program participants transition between floors.	\$100,000
Open Office Work Spaces	2	Staff work spaces for program teams to collaborate and innovate.	\$100,000
Collaboration Space	1	Collaboration space for high school students to participation in life skills groups, peer discussions, plan projects, and unwind from the day.	\$100,000
Large Flex Meeting Space	1	Open space with flexible seating for staff meetings.	\$100,000
Health & Wellness Storage Room	1	Organized storage center for health and wellness distribution items as well as seasonal in-kind donations (winter coats, backpacks, holiday gifts, etc.)	\$75,000
Staff Lounge	1	Space for the staff to take breaks and collaborate in small groups.	\$75,000
Executive Offices	4	Offices of the organizational leaders including the Executive Director, Chief Program Officer, Chief Financial and Operations Officer, and Chief Development Officer.	\$50,000
Small Flex Meeting Spaces	2	Open space with flexible seating for staff meetings.	\$50,000
Computer Work Stations	5	Within the Media Lab, Lounge, and flex meeting spaces for staff and program participant use.	\$25,000
Garden Benches	5	Weather-proof benches that provide rest for those that visit the Garden.	\$15,000
Media Lab	1	Dedicated space for older youth to build leadership skills and gain exposure to media arts in partnership with IAPW programs.	RESERVED
Older Youth Lounge	1	Dedicated space for older youth to socialize, snack and take a pause before after school programs.	RESERVED
